It is with sisterly love and affection that I greet you and share that the sorors of the Greensboro Alumnae Chapter (GAC) are proud to welcome you to the 2025 North Carolina Statewide Founders Day Observance in Greensboro, NC. We are excited to see this special occasion come to fruition as we recognize and celebrate the Founders Day theme of "Decades in Delta...Embrace the Dream, Embody the Legacy."

GAC lays claim to the South Atlantic's 15th Past Regional Director, Dr. Linda Wilson Cannaday, and the late Soror Alberta White, who collaborated on our Sorority's beloved "Sweetheart Song."

Greensboro, affectionately known as the "Gate City," has made its mark in history. While you are here, consider visiting The Historic Magnolia House. During America's Jim Crow-era, The Magnolia House Motel was a site listed in The Green Book. The book provided the Black community with advice on safe places to eat and sleep while traveling from state-to-state under segregation.

The renowned International Civil Rights Center and Museum was once a five-and-dime store called F. W. Woolworth where on February 1, 1960, four North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University freshmen: Ezell Blair, Jr. (Jibreel Khazan), Franklin McCain, Joseph McNeil, and David Richmond walked downtown and sat down at the store's "whites only" lunch counter. They refused to leave when denied service and stayed until the store closed. Their brave actions led to the desegregation of Woolworth's lunch counter in July 1960 and made a significant impact on other events in civil rights history.

The Gate City welcomes you while you embrace the bond of devotion and engage with sorors from across the state. You will recommit yourselves to the tenets set forth by 22 exceptional, collegiate women who we have come to know and admire as our Founders. How exciting it will be to interact with sorors who all walk in the spirit of One Delta! We know that you will leave this observance excited that you are a member of the incomparable Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated<sup>TM</sup>.

Dr. Joi L. Moore is a visionary community servant committed to helping others learn and lead successfully. She serves as the Associate Dean of Engagement and Outreach in the College of Education and as a Professor in the School of Information Science & Learning Technologies at the University of Missouri. She is also a faculty member in the MU Institute for Data Science & Informatics and an Affiliated Faculty member in the Black Studies Department.

Dr. Moore received two degrees from North Carolina State University: a B.S. in Computer Science and an M.S. in Management, focusing on Management Information Systems. After teaching in the Department of Computer Information Systems at Shaw University, Dr. Moore earned her Ph.D. in Instructional Technology from the University of Georgia, emphasizing Management Information Systems. She completed two leadership programs: the Management Development Program (MDP) at Harvard University and the Academic Leadership Development Program for the Southeastern Conference (SEC).

She is a subject matter specialist in Learning Design, E-Learning, and Usability. With over 25 years of experience creating instructional and training materials and various digital media forms, she has published five books and more than 80 articles.

Dr. Moore's professional service includes serving as President of the Minorities in Media Affiliate and the Training and Performance Division of the Association for Educational Communications and Technology (AECT). In 2024, she completed her term as the first Black woman president of the association.

Dr. Moore is a Golden Life Member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, and has numerous chapter, regional, and national leadership experiences. She was initiated into the Mu Omicron Chapter at North Carolina State University and is currently a member of the Columbia MO Alumnae chapter, where she served as Chapter President. National roles include National Secretary, Chair of the National Leadership Academy Committee, Chair of the 2015 National Nominating Committee, and Co-Chair of the National Grow with Google Ad-hoc Committee.

Every story she shares is a reflection of her devotion to her faith, using her gift to touch hearts, challenge minds, and bring healing to those who hear.


A'kasha's calling is clear: to speak words that resonate deeply, creating transformative experiences where listeners feel seen, heard, and connected to something greater than themselves.
